Solid results for King Alfred's Academy GCSE and Cambridge National students

King Alfred's Academy are pleased to once again congratulate our Year 11 class of 2026 who have achieved a commendable set of results this year. Students demonstrated great knowledge, determination and resilience during their preparations which has led to success across a broad curriculum for those who picked up their results today after five years of hard work.

On top of some outstanding individual results in subjects such as Maths, English, Economics, French, Music, Food and Nutrition and all three Sciences, nearly two thirds of our cohort achieved at least a standard pass grade in both GCSE English and Maths – a 'basics measure' that is crucial in terms of supporting access to further education and careers.

Particular mention goes to:

- Laurence who achieved a fantastic set of 10 GCSEs, of which 8 were a grade 9 and 2 were a grade 8.
- Isaac who achieved a remarkable 11 GCSEs, of which 6 were a grade 9, including Further Maths which he undertook independently.
- Liam who also achieved a marvellous 11 GCSEs, of which 5 were a grade 9, including Further Maths which he also studied for outside of normal classroom lessons.
- Millie and Sophie, both of whom achieved an impressive 3 grade 9s each amongst their collective 20 GCSEs at grades 9-7.

Headteacher, Jonathan Smart, commented "As a school we are very satisfied with this set of results. These GCSE and Vocational outcomes match the results achieved by last year's cohort. Each of our students should be enormously proud of the application and hard work demonstrated in achieving these outcomes. It is particularly pleasing that these results will allow the vast majority of our students to take the next step in their education or chosen career. I'd also like to pay tribute to the staff of King Alfred's Academy who have worked tirelessly to support our students throughout their time at the school."
