How to choose an elective?




1. Parents/ home are emailed the brochure on 11th January 2019
2. Students have **4 days** to talk to friends and family to select activities
3. Mon 14th January dedicated tutor time for students to give their 1st, 2nd and 3rd choices.
4. Tutors will make a note of these choices and they will be sorted centrally.
5. Oversubscribed electives will be allocated on a 'pick out of a hat' basis
6. NB Bus students must choose a Wednesday activity or parents must let us know about alternative arrangements for getting home ie not on the bus.
7. These January choices are for a 9-week programme (till Easter)
8. No swaps or changes after registers are made
9. Confirmation of students choice will be given out on Friday 18th January
10. Electives start on week commencing 21st January.
11. The DoE sign tells you which activity this elective can be used as towards your DoE Award.
