How to choose an elective?






1. Parents/ home are emailed the brochure on 26th April 2019
2. Students have **2 days** to talk to friends and family to select activities
3. Week beginning 29th April dedicated tutor time for students to give their 1st, 2nd and 3rd choices.
4. *Tutors will make a note of these choices and they will be sorted centrally.*
5. Oversubscribed electives will be allocated on a 'pick out of a hat' basis
6. NB Bus students must choose a Wednesday activity or parents must let us know about alternative arrangements for getting home ie not on the bus.
7. These April choices are for Terms 5 and 6.
8. No swaps or changes after registers are made
9. Confirmation of students choice will be given out on Friday 3rd May January
10. Electives start on week commencing 6th May
11. The DoE sign tells you which activity this elective can be used as towards your DoE Award.
